

East-Dennis Jan 29th 1867

Amos Otis Easton

Dear Sir

Your favour of 25th is read and contents carefully noted -
I agreed with you as I supposed as cashier
of the 1st National Bank of Yarmouth to renew
my note at that bank for \$5000 for 6 mos
at the rate of 8% accordingly I
made a note payable in New York (on which
exchange could be charged) and forwarded it
to you with 4% into and the price of stamps
but by an oversight did not send the note for the
days of grace. The note was renewed by your
board of directors at 7% you on the 1st inst sent
me a statement of the same showing a balance
due me of \$33 which was paid me by the Order
of said bank 25th inst for collection of coupons.

It seems by your letter of 25th that you intended
to have loaned me the money from your private
funds. If so it was the fault of mine that the
note was held before your directors for their action.

Under the circumstances you think you
are entitled to the extra 1% in addition to the
amount paid the bank you can retain it from
funds in your hands.

It seems by your letter of 25th that you intended to have loaned me the money from your present funds If so it was no fault of mine that the note was laid before your Directors for their action

If under the circumstances you think you are entitled to the extra ½% in addition to the amt paid the Bank you can retain it from funds in your hands


