[1841-07-28 Will of Nabby Stone<sup>[70]</sup>; a copy:]

In the name of God Amen

I Nabby Stone of Dennis in the County of Barnstable w'd do on this twenty eighth day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and forty one, do make and publish this my last will and testament in manner & form following viz

I order my executor hereinafter named to pay all of my just debts together with my funeral expenses to be paid out of the first money that shall come into his hands —

I give unto my beloved friends Judith Stone and Bridget Howes wife of Rufus Howes twenty dollars a piece, and all of my wearing apparel to be divided equally between them —

I also give and bequeath unto my beloved friends Nathan Stone & Abial Stone all the rest of my property both real & personal not disposed of, that may be found after my decease, to them and their assigns in equal shares between them — and all of my indoor moveables to be appraised and to be set off to Abial Stone as a part of his share —

Lastly I do appoint Nathan Stone Executor of this my last will & testament —
